CHRISM MASS 2024

The Chrism Mass, which this year will take place on Wednesday 27 March at 7.30pm in the Metropolitan Cathedral, is usually the largest annual gathering of archdiocesan clergy and faithful throughout the year. At the Mass, Archbishop Malcolm blesses the holy oils that are used throughout the archdiocese for celebrations of the sacraments in the next year. He does this in the presence of priests, deacons and lay faithful. Additionally, the Archbishop invites the priests of the archdiocese to renew the promises they made at their ordination: to dedicate their life in service to the Church - to preach the Gospel and teach the Catholic faith, to faithfully celebrate the sacraments and to pray for God's people. Everyone is welcome and encouraged to attend this liturgy which is enhanced by the Cathedral Choir.

DENISE PRICE RIP



A REFLECTION FOR MOTHER'S DAY

On Mother's Day, we give thanks for those who today and in years gone by have made sacrifices so that we might enjoy life. In many communities now, only to say thank you to Mothers, is to ignore all of those others who care for us. In families across the world, grandparents, relations, foster parents and social service carers provide motherly love and care to many children. Today therefore, we celebrate all who have provided and continue to provide such care. Loving and caring in this way is a sacrifice of self-giving and a vocation which not only means a daily grind of tiredness and worry but often involves experiencing the deepest of pain. The pain of watching what happens to a child when they are sick or dying can often be too difficult a burden for a mother. Mary understood that pain. At the death of her Son, she bore in

her body the pain of the cross – she felt the nails being hammered into his hands, she agonised as she watched him die the most painful of deaths. She had to release her child into God's eternal care long before his time and most likely would have felt a mixture of all the emotions a mother can feel - anger, guilt, shame, and a deep sense of loss. Her grief must have been unimaginable, yet she also understood the joy of motherhood – she watched her precious child grow to be a wonderful man - a special son. Today we stand with all 'Mother's' who face these emotions, we pray for them and pledge to provide help to those who find the burden of caring too difficult to manage alone. As we look around our world today, we reflect on the tremendous burden born by

mothers and other carers, as they watch the younger generation within our world dying due to the lack of drugs to treat those who are HIV positive; children dying because of the lack of clean water or the cost of a mosquito net; families struggling to understand and come to terms with the effects of war and persecution. In other ways, our celebration today is mixed with sadness and our hearts go out to those who are struggling with infertility and those who have lost babies. In the midst of whatever loss we may have suffered, let us give thanks today for what our own mothers mean to us and all

that they have meant to us in the past.
