REFLECTION

How many times have we looked up to the sky and seen grey clouds forming – a warning that a storm is coming? But stormy skies are not just related to a weather forecast! In our own lives when we face difficult or painful situations we talk about 'weathering the storm'. At such times as these, it is natural that we may feel anxious worried or afraid. In today's gospel, the disciples found themselves in a storm whilst at sea in a small boat. They too had every reason to be anxious, worried and afraid - but they were not alone. Out of the darkness came the person of Jesus walking on the water towards them. Initially, they were even more frightened as they thought it was a ghost. But Jesus, knowing how afraid they were, encouraged them saying 'Do not be afraid'. (Tradition says that this phrase is used 365 times in the bible!) In an act that was filled with bravado, Peter volunteered to walk on the water towards Jesus. He took his first few steps and was doing really well - until he saw the waves and then he sank. He cried out to Jesus, 'Lord, save me!' Jesus stretched out his hand and saved Peter. Getting back into the boat Jesus both calmed the storm and the disciples. Each of us has to deal with pain and difficulties - our own 'storms of life'. When we read or hear today's gospel, we tend to focus on the fact that Peter let fear get the better of him and he took his eyes off Jesus and sank. But he also had the faith, courage and humility to ask for help and cry out, 'Lord, save me'. Today, we are invited to examine our own faith journey. Like the disciples, from time to time we too face storms and challenges that test our faith, but Jesus reminds us to take courage, trust in him, and step out in faith. Even when we falter, we can call out to him, knowing that he is

us to take courage, trust in him, and step out in faith. Even when we falter, we can call out to him, knowing that he is ever-present and ready to save us. Ultimately, by recognising Jesus as the Son of God, we can find solace and strength, knowing that he walks with us through the storms of life, guiding us safely to the shores of his love and grace. No matter what we are experiencing, Jesus is always with us

- he will never leave us on our own.

THE FEAST OF THE ASSUMPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

Tuesday is the feast of the Assumption of the blessed Virgin Mary and is a Holy Day of Obligation. Please note the times of Masses at both churches.



Celebrated every year on August 15, the Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary commemorates the death of Mary and her bodily assumption into Heaven, before her body could begin to decay - a foretaste of our own bodily resurrection at the end of time. Because it signifies the Blessed Virgin's passing into eternal life, it is the most important of all Marian feasts and one of the oldest holy days in the Church, with accounts of celebrations going back to the sixth century. Christians in the East, both Catholic and Orthodox refer to it as the Feast of the Dormition of the Theotokos, or 'the falling asleep of the Mother of God'.
