## REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY

Remembrance Sunday is an important event in the Church's calendar because it helps us not to forget the reason why we have the freedom that we enjoy today.

It reminds us that the peace we have experienced here in our own country was not bought cheaply. Remembrance Sunday is more than a reminder of those who died in the First and Second World Wars, it is also a reminder of those who have lost their lives in conflicts such as the Falklands War, the Gulf War, Iraq, Afghanistan and more recently the conflict in the Ukraine. Today is set aside to remember those who have given their lives for the freedom of others and so we pause to remember the fallen and to say 'Thank you' for the sacrifice they made so that we can live in peace. Sadly, for some people today will come and go without them giving any real thought to the meaning of the day. What and why do we need to remember? We remember the reality of what actually happened. We remember the dedication of those who fought and died. Remembering should stir within us a sense of gratitude and appreciation. Remembering the commitment and sacrifice of others should also strengthen our own resolve to do our part in serving God and others.

Throughout scripture, we are told to stop and remember what God has done for us. God has been, and continues to be, at work in the daily lives of all His people. How often do we take the time to remember what God has done in our life? How often do we just pause and thank God for His presence in our life? Today is also a time when we inevitably remember those close to us that we have loved and lost. The memories we recall this Remembrance Sunday should spur us forward in the search for true harmony and peace throughout the world. As the Lord commanded the apostles to 'Do this in memory of me', we pray today that we may live in the harmony for which Christ prayed; and to our fallen we say 'We will remember them'.

### COVID REQUIREMENTS

The following guidelines from the Archdiocese are now in place:

1. **Face-coverings** are recommended for those attending Sunday Mass who are vulnerable.
2. **Sanitiser** - please sanitise your hands before entering the church.
3. **Ventilation** - with the onset of the recent cold weather, the church doors will now remain closed during Sunday services.
3. **Social Distancing** - there is **no** designated section of the church with social distancing.
3. **Holy Communion** - ministers will cleanse their hands before & after distributing HC.
4. **Holy Communion** under both kinds will **not** be reintroduced at this time.

**NB: Please be cautious and do not attend if you have any symptoms.**
