REFLECTION

One of the first questions we were ever asked as children during Catechism classes was 'who made you?' and we duly replied 'God made me'. The follow up question was 'why did God make you?' - the common answer for everyone being, 'God made me to know him, to love him, and to serve him in this world, and to be happy with him forever in the next'. John the Baptist, like Jesus, had a perfect knowledge of why he was made. Indeed, one of the things that Jesus and John had in common was a full knowledge of who they were and what their missions were - both men existed in the same time frame, their destinies were tied and for both, their various roles showed that in God there is no confusion. In today's Gospel, John the Baptist demonstrates a clear knowledge of his mission - he was sent to prepare the way for the Christ, to show who the Christ is and to lead people to him. He did not exaggerate his mission, nor did he profess to have more knowledge than was revealed to him – his sense of purpose in life was clear. In our world today, many of us seem to have lost our sense of purpose. We don't seem to be aware of why we were created. Of course, this could be as a result of some unbearable challenges we may have faced in life, but, no amount of problems can justify such a separation from God. John the Baptist, even though he lived in the time of Jesus was not free from problems and in fact lost his life while fulfilling God's will – yet he stuck unwaveringly to his purpose. We must therefore identify those things that cause us to lose our sense of purpose. One of the major reasons is sin. How many of us relapse in the momentary pleasures of sin, or are tormented by guilt or are completely disorientated and just obsessed with ourselves? John the Baptist calls Jesus the 'Lamb of God' and the 'Son of God'. By using these titles, he identifies Jesus' ultimate purpose: to redeem us from our sins. John the Baptist baptised in order to prepare for and make known the ministry of the One who was to follow. By our Baptism, we are called to make Jesus known by our words and by the way in which we live our lives. Let us pray that we

may all rediscover God's will and purpose in this world so that we may look forward to eternal happiness in the next.
