#### REFLECTION

The Gospel this Sunday begins with quite a clear statement that is very relevant for us today; 'Jesus told his disciples a parable about the need to pray continually and never lose heart.' This is the first of two parables that Jesus tells in Luke 18 about prayer - this first parable is a lesson in persistence in prayer. He tells the story of a woman who goes to a judge seeking justice. She keeps on at him, refusing to give up or give in. In the end he gives up and gives her what she is seeking. Jesus tells us that when we come to God in prayer, we are to have the same courage, strength and perseverance as the woman and that we too are not to give up or give in. Perhaps in the same way as preparing to run a marathon, a life of prayer takes time, discipline, practise, patience and perseverance - it doesn't just happen by itself. We can talk about prayer, we can read about prayer and we can even watch others pray, but unless we make a start ourselves, we will never learn to pray. As the saying goes, practise make perfect! Sometimes maintaining a regular prayer life can be

difficult, even frustrating at times. It can feel as if our prayers are not being heard or answered which can often be disheartening. But Jesus encourages us not to give up or to give in; he simply says to us, keep going, hang in there, I am with you and I am listening to you. So what do we do when we can't pray? Simply pray the prayers we have known since childhood - The Our Father, The Hail Mary and The Rosary. When we sit or kneel to pray, it is worth remembering that it is God who calls us to pray in the first place. Our decision to pray is our response to that divine and sacred call. Prayer is about our daily relationship with God - it nourishes and strengthens that relationship. Prayer is not just about us talking to God; it also and perhaps more importantly, is about us listening to God. Today and during the coming week, let us ask God to give us that same courage, faith, patience and perseverance as the persistent woman in the gospel and like her may we be confident that God will hear and answer our prayers. May we always approach God with hope and humility and may we pray continually and never lose heart.
