For those young people in Year 8 attending Catholic High Schools in the Liverpool Archdiocese, preparation and registration will be coordinated through the school. Any young people in Year 8 attending non-Catholic High Schools can register for Confirmation preparation at www.liverpoolcalled.co.uk. They will then be invited to take a part in a 'catch up' session that will try to cover what they have missed in the RE classes of our diocesan Catholic schools. There is a poster in the church porch which contains a QR code which candidates from non-Catholic High Schools can scan in order to register.

REFLECTION

Today's Gospel describes how Jesus at the start of his public ministry called on people to follow him. In the case of the first of his disciples, they weren't praying at the time, nor were they in the temple or the synagogue but we are told he called on them whilst they doing their ordinary daily work of fishing and mending their nets on the sea shore. Jesus called them by their names and the disciples immediately dropped everything to follow him. Many of us today would find such a sudden and radical request impossible - there are probably only a few things for which we would willingly contemplate dropping everything without question - and yet this is the immediacy with which these first disciples responded to Jesus. They were willing to drop everything in order to make Jesus and the Kingdom of God the most important things in their lives. Without doubt, all four of these men would have had dreams and expectations of their own, most likely involving their families and their fishing business. But the gospel doesn't say anything about their expectations because it focuses on what is most important - Jesus called them, and they trusted him enough to follow him. Of course when they followed him many things changed. They were not catching fish anymore, but people. They were traveling with Jesus around Galilee and Judea, listening to his teaching, witnessing his death and resurrection, and proclaiming the good news throughout the world. Jesus called them and they followed him - he sent them out in his name, not their own. Today, in the same way, Jesus continues to call each of us by our own name through our ordinary daily lives and activities. Those in the gospel today dropped everything they were doing and followed Jesus when he called them - our response may not be quite as quick, but it doesn't need to be! We all follow Jesus at our own pace, in our time and in our own way. The important thing to remember is that Jesus never stops calling us by our name, continually inviting us to follow him with these words, 'if you want to be my disciple, come, take up your cross and follow me'. Let us pray that in our needy world of today, we will all strive to do our best, as now more than ever we are called to reach out to others.
