REFLECTION

In the general calendar of the Church, this 'Seventh Sunday of Easter' is the Sunday which falls between the celebration of the Ascension of the Lord and the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. Today's Gospel reading is the beginning of a prayer, sometimes called Jesus' 'High-Priestly Prayer', which appears at the conclusion of the Last Supper just before Jesus is arrested in the garden. It is the longest recorded prayer of Jesus in the Gospel. It unfolds in three main sections: Jesus prays for himself (Jn 17:1-5), then for his apostles who have been closely associated with him during his mission (Jn 17: 6-19) and finally for the unity of future disciples (Jn 20-26). He prays for his disciples, present and future, who will face opposition and for those who will welcome his Word. All three parts are, in this way, caught up in the one and same offering of Jesus to the Father. In this
