### REFLECTION

This Sunday we experience another appearance of the Risen Lord to two of his friends and followers. The two disciples are leaving Jerusalem and are walking to Emmaus. Having just experienced the betrayal, denial, condemnation and death of their close friend, Jesus, they have turned their back on the place where their dreams were shattered, and, with a sense of failure and grave disappointment they leave Jerusalem. As they walk along, they are talking about all the events that have just happened. As they carry on their journey a stranger comes alongside them and asks them a simple and polite question; 'What are you talking about as you walk along?'. They ask if he is the only one who does not know about all the things that have happened in Jerusalem. The stranger asks them another question; 'What things? He is interested in everything that has happened to them. As they walk and talk, the stranger simply listens to them. Only when they have told him of all the things that have happened to them does he reveal that he is the Risen Lord! Jesus makes as if to go on, but they press him to stay and to share supper with them. Whilst they are at table, he takes bread, blesses it and hands it to them and at once, their eyes and hearts are opened. This is an image and symbol of the Pilgrim Church which we are all part of. We too are walking along with each other as members of the Body of Christ. We are not alone - Jesus walks with us on our journey as individuals and as a church. He is deeply interested in our story and asks each of us what our own personal experience and story is. As we walk along on our journey through life, Jesus walks by our side and listens to us just as he walked along the road to Emmaus with the two disciples. He asks us to tell him our story and waits for us to share with him what is most important to us. Each of us has a personal, unique and sacred story. Pope Francis reminds us of this when he says, 'Each of us have a story; a story of grace, a

#### RETURN TO A NEW NORMAL?

As of Maundy Thursday the Bishop's of England and Wales have said that Communion under both kinds can be re-introduced at Masses.

Thank you to all those who expressed an opinion in response to my request for views on this last week. Whilst there was a wide range of views, the over riding majority was to start at the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Maundy Thursday. A number of people expressed their desire to receive communion under both kinds and so this will be offered, however, please can I emphasise that this is an option and no one including Eucharistic Ministers should feel that they have to receive from the chalice.

I have reintroduced the phrase 'Let us offer each other the sign of peace' and again people are free to offer that sign in whatever way they feel comfortable. As for coming forward for communion, each Mass is different and so a flexible approach will be adopted until new norms develop. However, I don't feel there is a need for stewarding of people to communion but it would be nice if the slow and dignified queuing continued.

The Ministry of Welcome which has grown since Covid will be retained.
