REFLECTION

In today's gospel, Jesus raises Lazarus from the dead and urges us to live and believe in him as he offers us the hope and promise of eternal life. Surprisingly, when Jesus receives the news that his good friend Lazarus, the brother of Mary and Martha is sick and near to death, he does not rush to see him and comfort his family. On arriving, Jesus finds that Lazarus has been in the tomb for four days already and as he approaches the house, Jesus is met by Martha who is less than happy to see her friend. Even in the midst of sorrow and bereavement, she clearly says to Jesus, 'if you had been here, my brother would not have died.' And then she continues with deep faith and belief in Jesus and says, 'but I know that, even now, whatever you ask of God, he will grant you.' Even though she is angry with Jesus, she hasn't given up on him completely. Jesus assures her that her brother will rise again and then he proclaims clearly, 'I am the resurrection and the life, if anyone believes in me....they will never die.' After saying this, he looks directly at Martha and asks her, 'Do you believe this?' Without any hesitation, she replies, 'Yes, Lord, I believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God.' Despite her loss, grief and pain, Martha

is still able to have faith and confidence in Jesus as the Resurrection and the life who has come into the world. This gospel is like a sign-post that points and leads us to Holy Week. On Holy Thursday we will be asked to stand with Jesus as he is betrayed; on Good Friday he will be condemned, beaten and crucified and he will die. There is no way of ignoring or avoiding the reality of the death of Jesus. But the cross is not our final destination - it is only a stage on our journey, not only through Lent, but in our lives too. With the women who stood by him, we too must stand at the foot of the cross before we can experience the joy of the resurrection. On Good Friday, we are asked to experience the reality of death, but we are also asked to have faith in Jesus as Martha did. As we take another step on our Lenten journey, Jesus says to each of us, I am the resurrection and the life, do you believe this? As we face the reality of Good Friday, let us also look towards the new life of Easter Sunday. Jesus is still the resurrection and the life, if we

believe in him, we shall not die.
