REFLECTION

Today's gospel raises a vital question from Jesus: 'But who do you say that I am?' If we were to introduce Jesus to others, how would we define him? At the time of Jesus, he was not the only travelling preacher. There were others who had their own vision and ideas, all vying for people's attention, all looking for followers and disciples. When it came to Jesus, there were all sorts of rumours about who he was and were he came from - even Jesus' own disciples and followers asked questions about him! As if reading their minds, Jesus turned and asked his friends this very direct and challenging question, 'Who do people say the Son of Man is? His friends offered him plenty of names, among them John the Baptist and Elijah. Others thought he was the prophet Jeremiah or one of the other prophets. Then he asked them an even more challenging question, 'But, you, who do you say that I am?' Jesus was in fact saying to them, don't tell me what others have said or told you about me, do not repeat the rumours you have heard on the street corners or in the synagogue. He was asking them, who am I to you? This was a very personal question that Jesus asked them and he asks us the same question today. Through this gospel, Jesus is challenging us to define who we think he is and what he means to us. Jesus wants us not only to be honest with ourselves but also with him and he calls each of us by name to enter into a personal relationship with him. He will never force himself into our lives, it's our choice - a choice which is built on free will and love. At some point in our daily lives we must all try and answer the question that Jesus puts to his friends in today's gospel. As we build our friendship with Jesus on prayer and caring for others, we discover who Jesus is and more personally what Jesus means to us. We won't find the answer to this question in a textbook. We will only discover who Jesus is by trying to build and maintain an intimate friendship with him and we do this through caring for others, especially the poor and marginalised. So today, when Jesus asks us the question who do you say I am? let us think very carefully about how we would respond?
