REFLECTION

There is nothing quite like a good meal with our friends and family! Whenever we share a meal with those we love, we experience a sense of joy, community and belonging. The same was true at the time of Jesus. We know from the gospel readings, that Jesus sat and ate with many people. In those days, to share a meal with another person was a sign of equality and often all those around the table ate from the same plate or bowl.

However, if you were sick in any way you were not allowed to sit at the table with others, even members of your own family. To be sick was to be seen as a sinner being punished by God. The Scribes, Pharisees and the Jewish elders decided who could come into the Temple, or the synagogue and who could sit at table to share a meal. If a person didn't reach the required standard, then they were ignored, dismissed and unable to eat with others. Jesus was very well aware of this as he himself often ate with those who were ignored, hated and dismissed - in his eyes, all were invited and welcome. In today's readings the imagery of the meal and banquet are used to depict God's generosity. The first reading tells us that the Lord will prepare a meal of rich wine and food, remove the veil of sadness and that all people will be invited to this celebration. In the gospel, Jesus continues this message. The meal is prepared but those invited give various excuses as to why they could not come to the

feast. In response, the king invited and welcomed strangers, good and bad alike. Jesus too calls us all by our name and invites us personally to come to the feast but it is up to us whether or not we accept this invitation. When we gather to celebrate the Eucharist, Jesus is the host and we are his guests. The Eucharist is offered to us freely and we are invited to respond freely. God invites us all but in return he asks us to repent for our sins. As Pope Francis reminds us, 'the Eucharist is not a prize for the perfect but a powerful medicine and nourishment for the weak... the church is a place for everyone, with all their problems.'
